The keeping or family room opens to the kitchen and porches on both sides of the house.



The magnificent front porch, removed in the 1950s, has been completely restored, returning to public view the front doors once hidden behind a brick structure added when the building was used as a church between 1940 and 1998.



This ample deck replaced and enlarged an old back porch. Multiple doors open to the kitchen and family room. Steps lead to planting beds and a large driveway.



The nicely sheltered side yard includes a Pergola, brick patio and grassy area that have accommodated weddings, receptions and other gatherings.



The Historic Oakwood neighborhood is an eclectic urban village seamlessly surrounded by unique urban neighbors pictured below. The value of property in Oakwood is increased by its status as a local Historic District, the first in NC.



The Oakwood Common a few blocks away is a play area for toddlers and often the site of the annual spring jazz brunch, 4th of July picnic and hot cider during the Candlelight Tour in December. Canines can play at the nearby Oakwood Dog Park.



Grab lunch and vanilla coke at the Person Street Pharmacy that dates back to 1910. The Person street shops include the PieBird restaurant, Marsh Woodwinds jazz venue, Nicoles Gallery, and the new Rapid Fitness Center. More coming in the fall.
