



One more surprise - this is the bright master suite that includes two small and a one big walk-in closet.



Open shelves and shutters were also added upstairs by the sellers when they reconfigured the upstairs, renovating the master bedroom and remodeling the bath in 2008.



The basket-weave Carrera marble floor (2008) evokes the old as does the refinished tip-toe tub with subway-tile surround and antique vanity.



Nicely accenting the old house character is the new gracefully shaped, enameled cast iron vanity counter top.



This is not your great-grandmother's closet, though it may have been her nursery.



The second upstairs bedroom includes a door leading to exterior metal stairs that once provided access to an upstairs apartment. The stairs could easily be removed and sold for scrap.



Back downstairs, the bright front bedroom could be part of an in-law or 2nd master suite that includes the yellow room (pictured below) with an adjoining full bath.



This is a versatile space once used a fourth bedroom. The right door leads to laundry a half-level down. The left door opens to the remodeled downstairs full bath. See floor plan for options to remodel and/or expand this and other spaces.



Bigger than it looks from the front, the house is nicely framed by the 0.17 acre lot. As a national, not local, historic district, Mordecai homes do not require Historic Commission approval of exterior changes.
