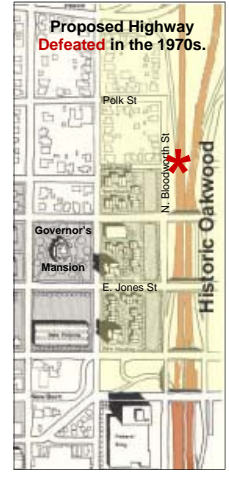
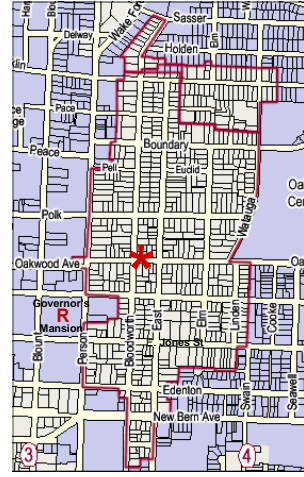
Oakwood is an urban village
