

# Location

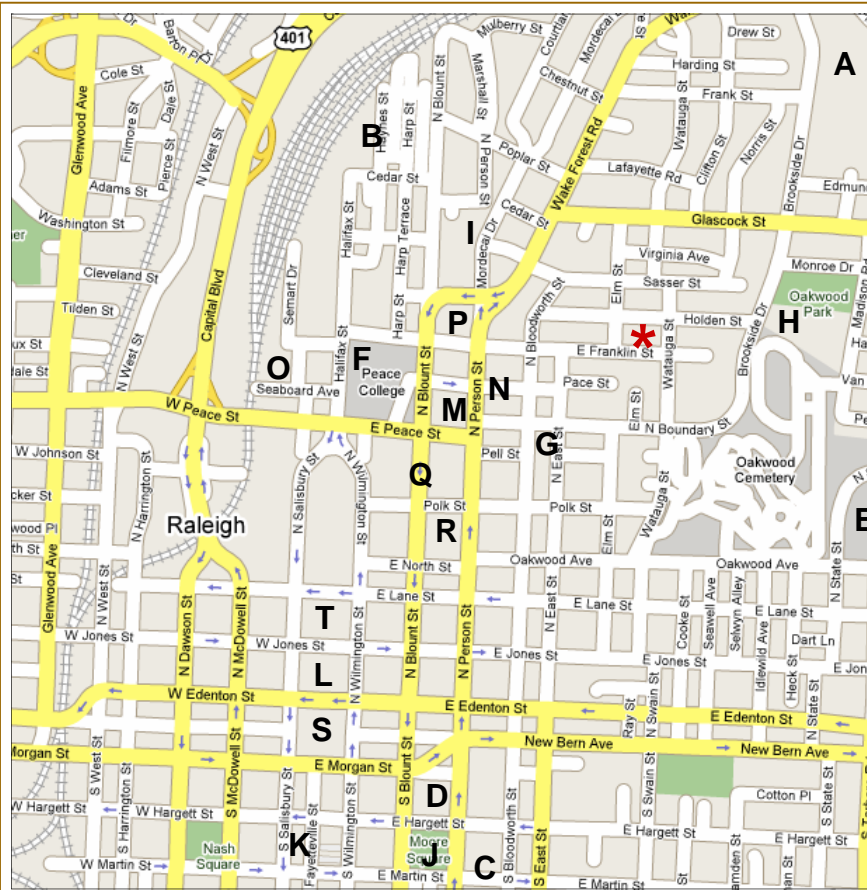
612 & 612-1/2 Holden Street

This home is located just outside the "local" Oakwood Historic District outlined in the map below left. Most of the houses in Oakdale and nearby Mordecai date from the 1920's to the 1950's when the area was developed during the building boom following World War I.



Call for the names of neighbors who can tell you about schools, kids, the nearby dog park, vanilla cokes at the Person Street Pharmacy lunch counter, the new Ace Hardware and other shops and restaurants at Seaboard Station.

What might have been .... A proposed north-south expressway would have run two blocks away between Bloodworth and East Streets as shown on the map below right. Neighbors helped defeat this proposal early in the 1970's.

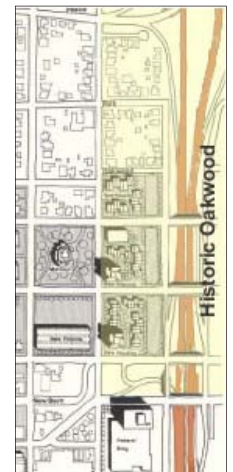
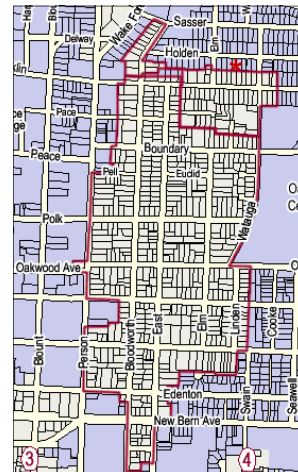
