
Location. In the 1990's, Gregory Peck and Lauren Bacall starred in a movie set in a nearby house on Polk St, one of the most picturesque streets in Raleigh. An antique wrought iron and brick fence encloses the yard of this, the Wayne Alcott House, c.1893. Alcott and his wife also built the house next door, operating it as grocery store in the 1890's.



Character. This Queen Anne home has a steep gable-on-hip roof covered with slate, and scalloped siding in the gables and between the stories. A circular flower petal window brightens the foyer with its handsome staircase and chandelier. Classically elegant tall windows, built-in bookcases and handsome mantels greet your guests as they enter the living and dining rooms. Note the china shelves in the dining room. The floor plan is great for entertaining with doors connecting the living and dining rooms, as well as the side hall.




A remarkable remodeling provides a symphony of arches in a dramatic yet practical "L" shaped kitchen, breakfast and family/sitting room area that opens on to a side deck overlooking a brick fence enclosed patio. The foyer leads back to breakfast room through the cozy family/sitting room with plantation shutters.



A Dacor gas stove, solid surface and tile counters are all part of the big, bright gourmet kitchen.



The upstairs floor plan is versatile with 3 bedrooms, 2 full baths, a nursery/office and a long open hallway. This is the modern master bath, one of two full upstairs bathrooms. There is a half bath downstairs. All four fireplaces in the house are decorative.
