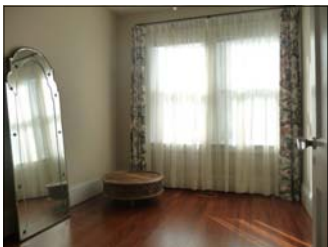

The porch overlooks the large park behind the Project Enlightenment School that is an elementary school resource center for Wake County. Google it.

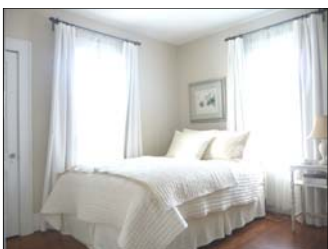
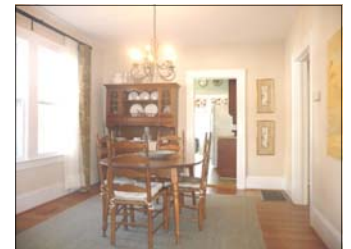
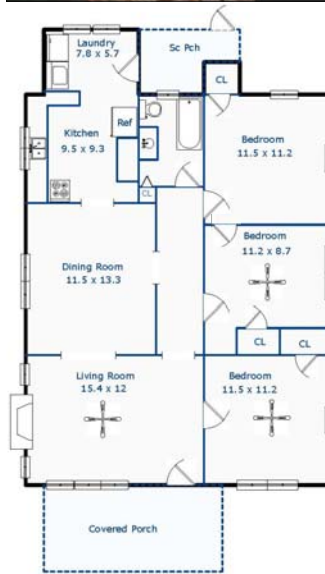


Great Floor Plan
The house feels bigger because of the center hall leading past the back two bedrooms and opening to the dining room. Lots of light during the day and gas logs at night create an inviting gathering space in the living room. The adjacent front bedroom is now used an study. More options - a door connects the back and middle bedrooms creating a master suite, a convenient nursery, sitting room, whatever. The bright kitchen opens to the back yard through a small screened porch, offering options for future expansion.



*NC Rehab Tax Credits**

Enjoy the kitchen as is with its modern appliances. Remodel it later possibly using NC Rehab Tax Credits. Credits may cover part of the cost of remodeling the dated but fully functional bathroom, making other updates to the home, and removing the asbestos siding to expose the existing wood lap siding now visible on the back screened porch.



Nearby New Construction

Over the back creek, four new homes are being built on a short dead-end street as part of Rosengarten Park, which includes a number of renovated homes. City plans propose a greenway also running on the other side of the creek.
